Many bricks can be dated because they had the mark of the ruling king stamped into them. How long will these bricks take to dry? (Several days depending up on the weather.) A brick maker could make a 1,000 bricks a day. Have students mix bricks and form them into a brick mold. Have them mark their name in their brick.

Later on in this story, one punishment from the pharaoh was for the Israelites to have to make bricks without using straw. Why do you think this would make it harder to make the same number of bricks in one day?

Read Exodus 2:24-25. Remember that just as God heard the Israelites, He hears us when we pray, and he cares for us.

You might enjoy making bricks at home to coincide with this study of the Call of Moses. Can you build a pyramid at home? What else could you make? Have fun!

Adobe Recipe: Mix two cups of dirt with water. Add bits of straw and sand until the mix is stiff. Use an ice cube tray as a mold. Put the tray in a warm place to dry. After 10 days the bricks should be dry for building.
